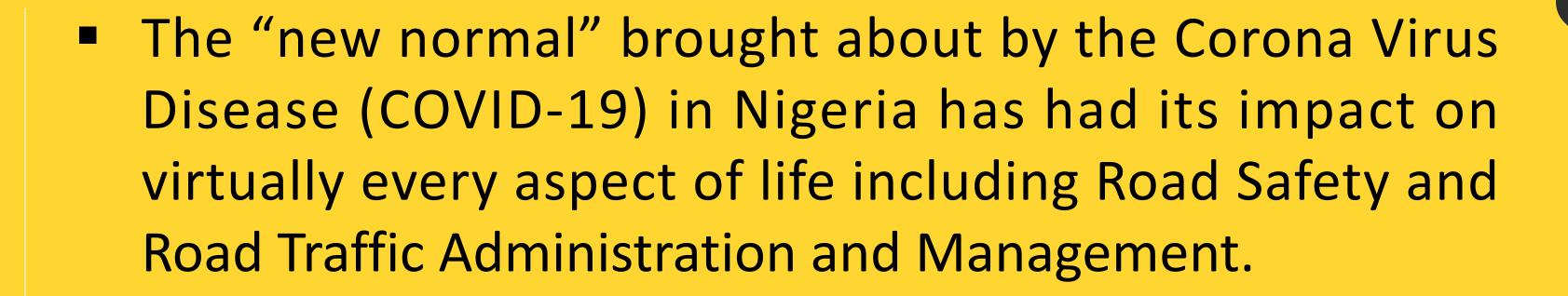

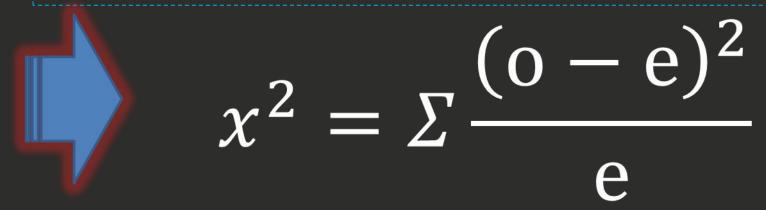
#### Review of Strategy – 1/3

The Goals of the Year which were tailored to building a strong capacity for Road Safety Management and fostering a cohesive stakeholder engagement, has been partially realized due to slowing down of general activities in the country.



Developments in this regard are reflected in the daily Presidential
 Task Force briefing anchored by the SGF, Boss Mustapha.

The disparity in Observation and Expectations on RTCs in the First Quarter (Q1) was high based on chi-square analysis



This was even before the COVID-19 Pandemic and the trend (Q1) is a serious source of concern.

Goals 2, 3 and 4 have been significantly affected due to:

- Slowing down of the economy,
- Restriction in Vehicular and human movements due to the pandemic,
- New Government Guidelines.

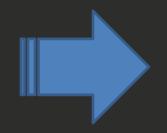

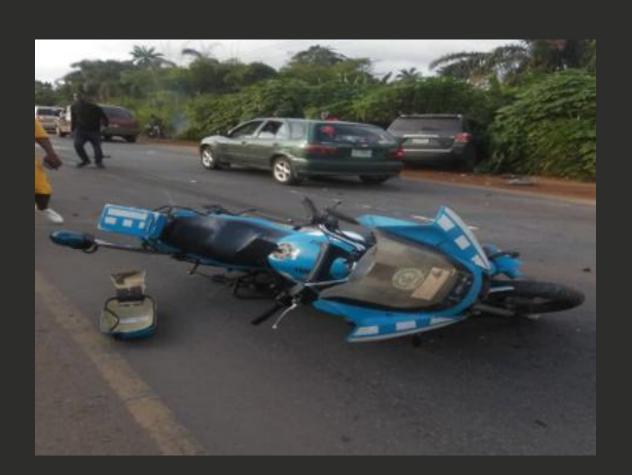

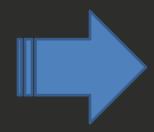
### Involvement of FRSC Vehicles in Crashes (January to June, 2020): Some Pictorials - I

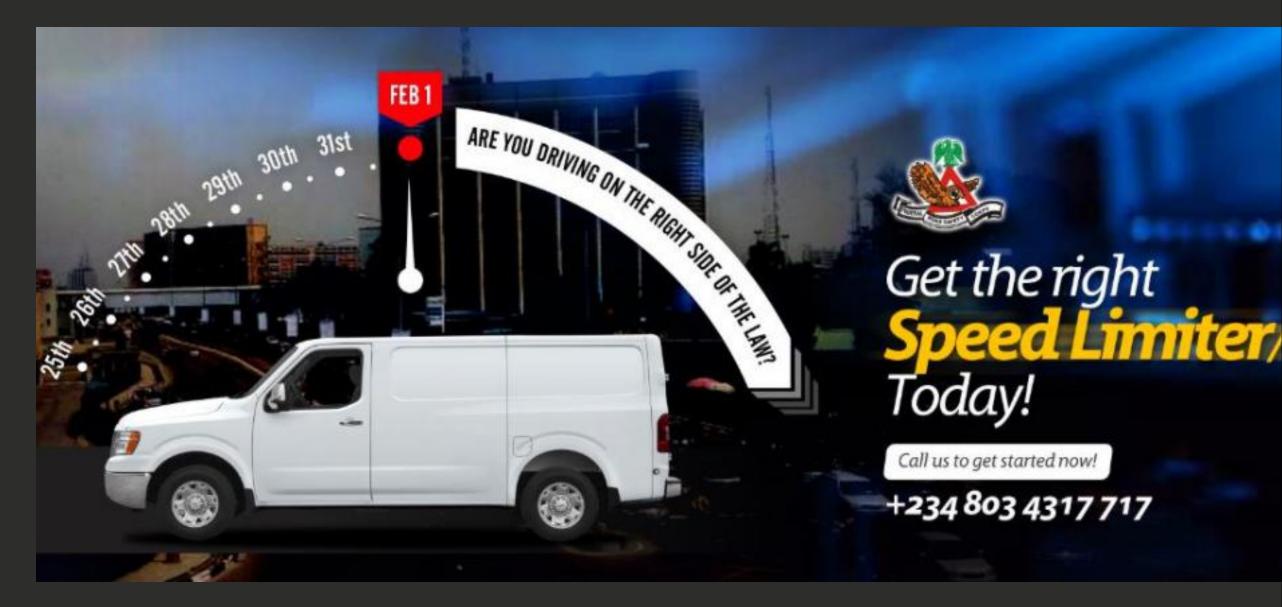


Patrol Operatives should avoid using their bodies as shields to stop vehicles.

However, recent reports of the collection of  $\maltese$  15,000 –  $\maltese$  20,000 by Field Commands as a pre-condition is a negative development.

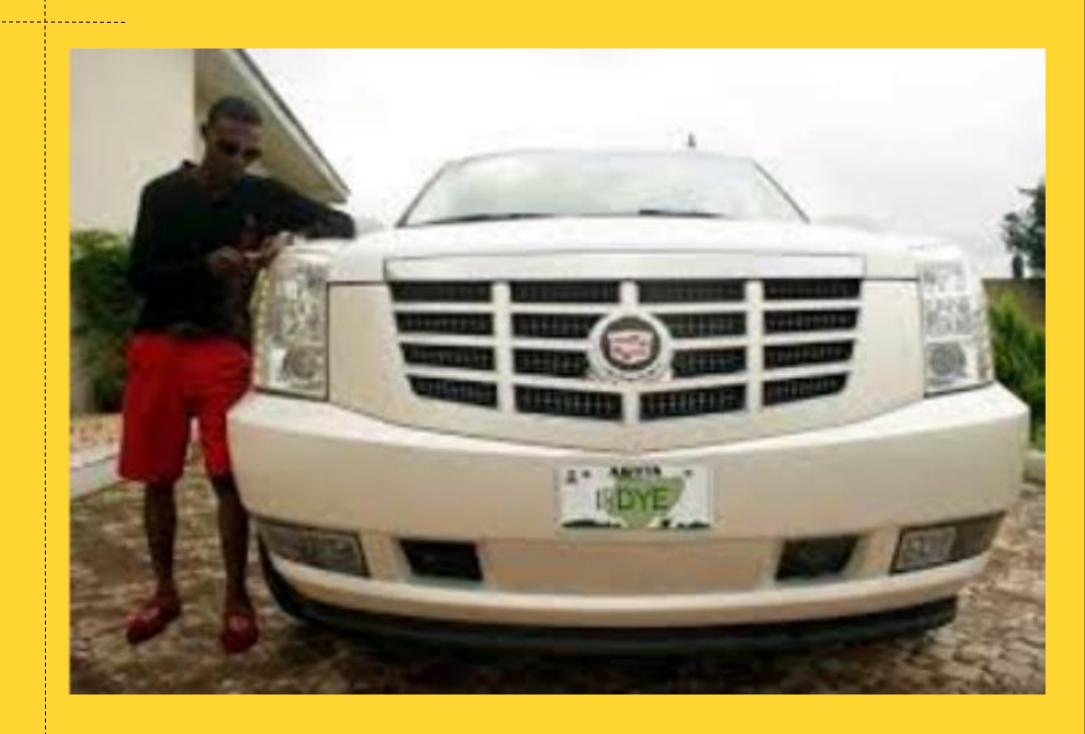
#### **Use of Reflective Jackets to Cover Name Tags**

Swift decline in Command & Control in Field Commands is manifesting in many other forms inimical to organizational growth.



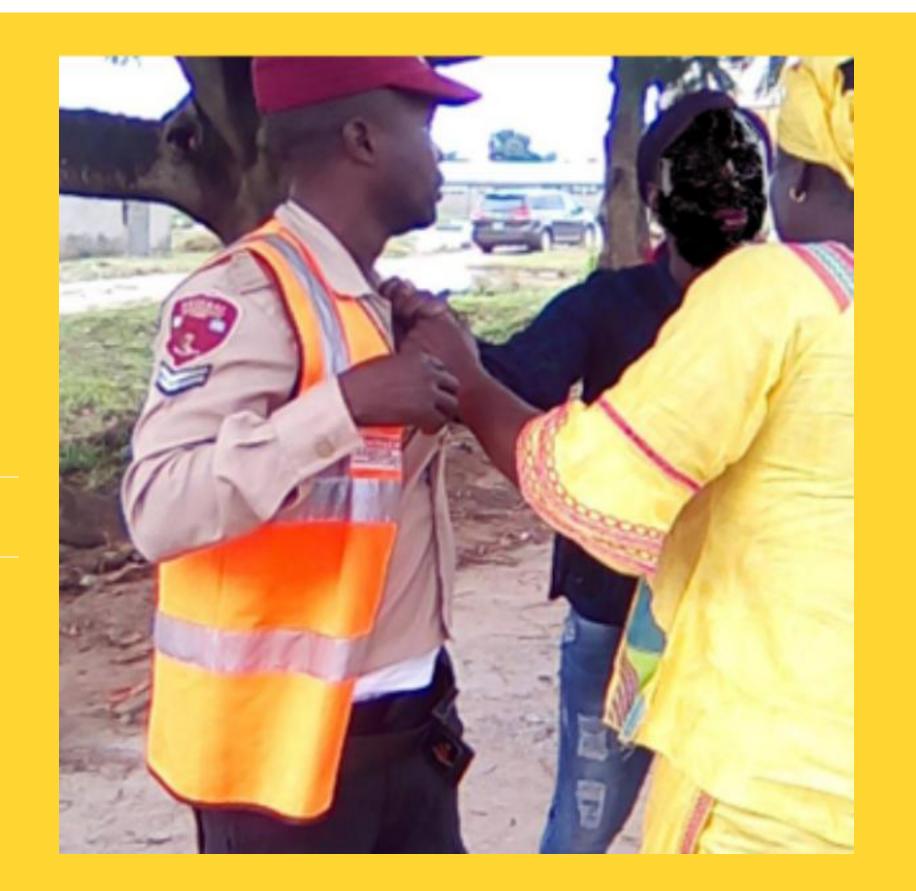


#### **General Indiscipline and Lifestyles**

- Distribution of P-P-E and Hand Sanitizers.





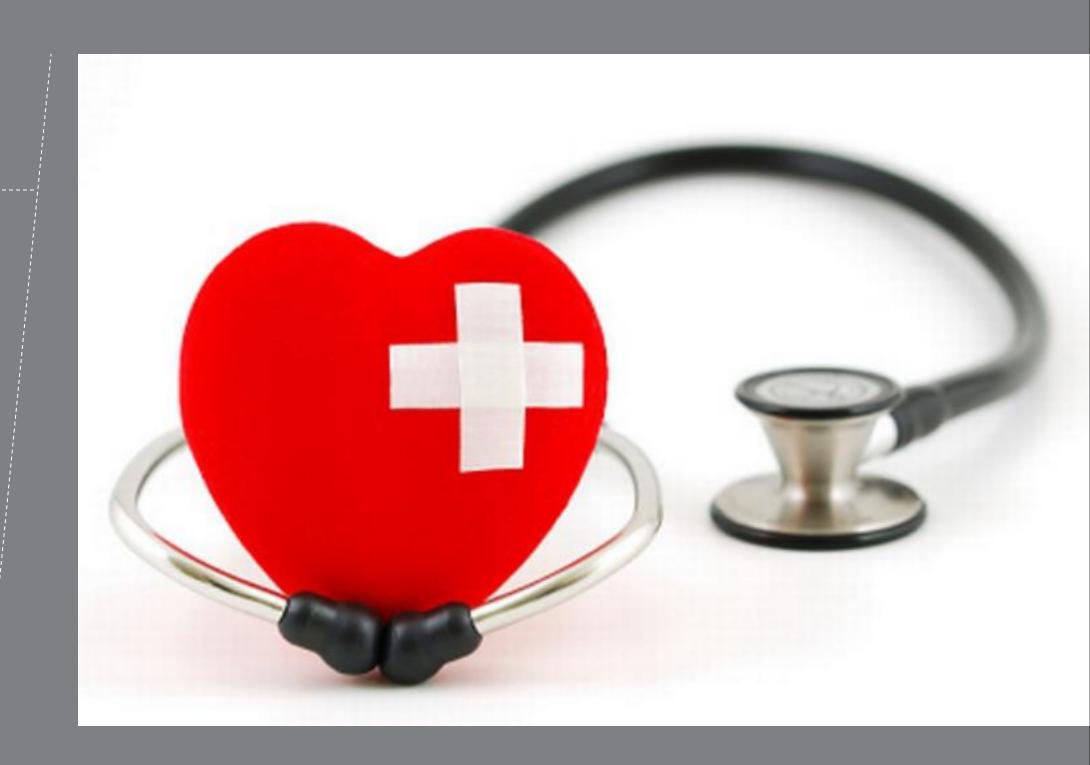


In relieving the burden brought about by the COVID- 19 pandemic, RCAs have been earmarked for Staff to cushion the effect.

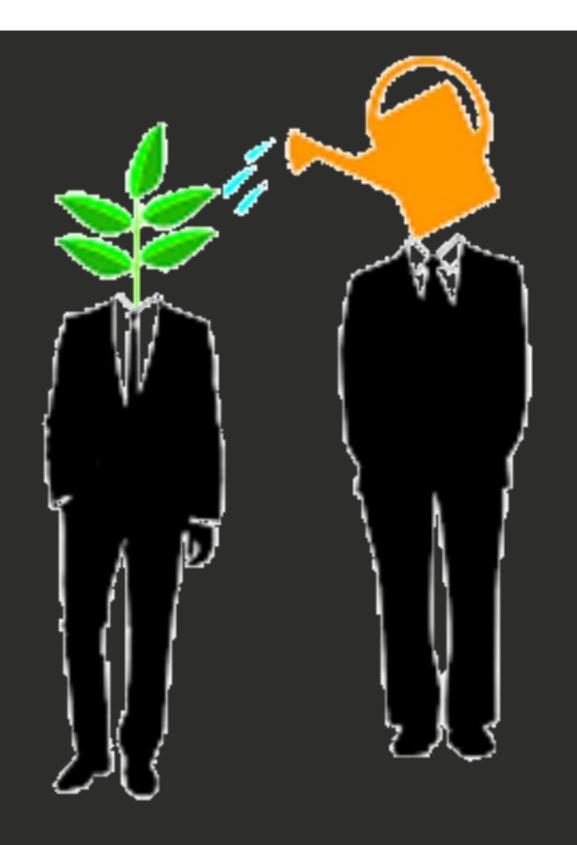

Infuse high level of maintenance to our facilities especially the new office buildings.

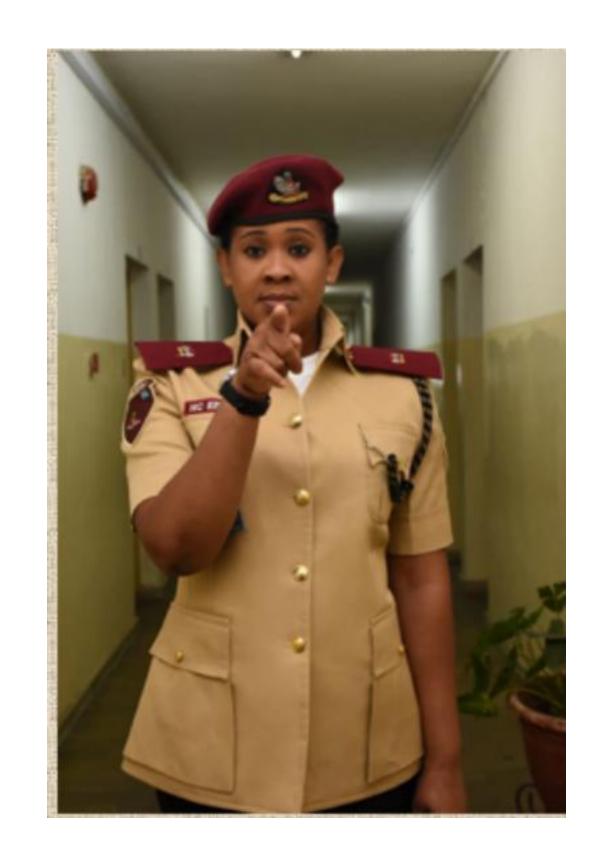
